The department boasts of a robust triage system, categorising patients based on the severity of their condition. The two-bed section for extremely critical

patients, three beds for moderately critical cases, and three for less critical patients are distinctly color-coded to facilitate rapid and appropriate care. This systematic



approach enhances patient outcomes and ensures efficient resource utilisation.

Further strengthening its capabilities, the emergency setup includes a dedicated **negative/positive pressure room**, crucial for infection control. The department is also equipped with four ventilator-supported beds, a significant ratio that enhances critical care readiness.



With round-the-clock availability of specialists trained in emergency medicine, Woodlands ensures expert intervention at all times. The emergency department is also

equipped with a procedure room for minor procedures and 24x7 radiological investigation facilities, enabling swift diagnosis and treatment for trauma and accident cases.

Key emergency diagnostic tools such as **Troponin I and Troponin T tests**, **portable ECG**, **ECHO**, **ultrasound**, **and**

defibrillators further reinforce the hospital's capacity to handle medical emergencies with precision and speed.

GIST: The Tumour That Refuses to Play by the Rules

It is said that a leopard cannot change its spots. This is one tumour that changed itself like a chameleon right in front of our very eyes. We were taught how to distinguish between leiomyomas and leiomyosarcomas of the

stomach on barium meal studies during our medical student days.

However, in 1983, by which time we were all knocking at the door of entering post-graduate training, Mazur and Clark at the University of



ESMO guidelines on neo-adjuvant and adjuvant therapy for gist molecular biology directed

Minnesota, discovered that all these so-called sarcomas had S-100 proteins in them, implying that they originated from nerve sheaths! Kindblom and his associates in 1998 proved that the cells of origin were the Interstitial Cells of Cajal, the intestinal pacemaker cells! Cajal was given his due after 100 years of his discovery!

The world knew that complete resection of the tumour was a mandatory step in its cure, but researchers realised that stomach GISTs behaved better than non-gastric GISTs. The next serendipitous step was the realisation that a drug used for AML often made inoperable GISTs disappear – Imatinib Mesylate. However, the honeymoon period for Imatinib was reasonably short-lived. This opened the doors to molecular biology and advances in that field exposed a huge vista of previously unknown facts. Tyrosine kinase, a trans-membrane kinase binds to a stem cell factor

outside the cell and stimulated ATP, the power generator






Patient who presented with torrential bleeding dropping her haemoglobin to 3.4mgm/dl, required urgent resuscitation and resection
