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Advancing Women's Health with Robotic Surgery at Woodlands Hospital

At Woodlands Hospital, women's health challenges are being made easier with groundbreaking solutions that combine compassion with cutting-edge technology. One such advancement is robot-assisted gynaecological surgery, a modern approach that is transforming the way complex conditions are treated and giving women renewed hope for healthier futures.

Under the expertise of Dr. Poushali Sanyal, Consultant – Gynaecology, Obstetrician, and Laparoscopic & Robotic Surgery, a patient with multiple fibroids and a history of infertility recently underwent a robotic myomectomy. With age nearing 40, preserving uterine shape and ensuring faster recovery were critical to improving her chances of conception. Robotic Surgery offered these advantages, along with unmatched precision, minimal blood loss, and significantly reduced post-operative pain compared to conventional laparoscopy.

Two large fibroids were successfully removed, and the patient's recovery was swift. She was able to walk the very next day, discharged within 48 hours, and within two weeks had resumed her daily routine with ease. Dr. Sanyal emphasises that Robotic Pelvic Surgery ensures better wound healing, enabling patients to plan for pregnancy within three to six months. She notes, "Robotic Pelvic Surgery is more precise, with less pain and faster recovery. It represents the future of gynaecology."

This case reflects Woodlands Hospital's commitment to making women's healthcare more effective and accessible through advanced medical technology and compassionate care. Mrs. Nivedita Mukherjee had been living with several serious health conditions, including diabetes, hypertension and morbid obesity, with her weight ranging between 133 and 135 kilograms. Her condition became critical when she was admitted to Woodlands Hospital with severe chest pain, excessive sweating and breathing difficulties.



Recognising the complexity of her case, a multidisciplinary team worked together to manage both the immediate cardiac emergency and the underlying medical concerns affecting her health.

Dr. Prasun Kumar Mitra, Consultant, Cardiology and Critical Care, Woodlands Hospital, played a key role in assessing her condition. **Dr. Souharta Dutta, Registrar in Dr. Mitra's Unit**, identified additional complications, including chronic leg ulceration and longstanding plaque related issues.

During a critical phase of treatment, **Dr. Susmita Debnath, Consultant, Critical Care**, stabilised the patient and prepared her for coronary angiography. With the support of **Dr. Anusua Banerjee, Consultant, Cardiac Anaesthesia**, and the Cardiology team, the procedure was completed safely.

Following intensive treatment and close monitoring, Mrs. Mukherjee made a steady recovery and was discharged in a stable condition. Her recovery reflects the clinical expertise, seamless teamwork and compassionate care that continue to define patient care at Woodlands Hospital.

From Open Surgery to Robotic Precision: A New Chapter in Healthcare

Sweeping changes have marked the evolution of surgery techniques over the decades. From traditional open procedures in blood-soaked theatres leaving visible scarring to minimally-invasive laparoscopy and onto computer-aided robotics to reduce trauma and enhance precision, surgery has pivoted across milestone phases with elan.

When Laparoscopic Surgery Gained Currency

By the 70s and 80s, the big disruption in the shape of laparoscopic surgery arrived, with the aim to minimise the complexity of operations and the trauma of cuts themselves. Initially frowned upon, the new method swiftly revolutionised the practice, with surgeons now operating through a video screen instead of looking directly at the patient. The benefits were stupendous such as reduced pain, early mobilisation, shorter hospital stays and improved cosmetic outcomes.

A Few Challenges Though

While offering a clutch of advantages over Open Surgery, Laparoscopic Surgery came with a few challenges. One key issue was limited range of motion for the surgical instruments. These tools are usually straight and inflexible, making certain manoeuvres difficult in constricted spaces. The other was the two-dimensional view offered by the laparoscope, making spatial orientation trickier than in open surgery.

Robotic Surgery Arrives

These limitations of laparoscopic surgery soon begged the question – “Can a surgical platform combine the dexterity of open surgery with the advantages of minimally-invasive access?”

Robotic Surgery offers a persuasive answer. In the robotic system, the surgeon sits at a console, while the robotic arms replicate his/her movements inside the patient. Quite a few handicaps of the laparoscopic method can be overcome by articulated instruments with 240-degree dexterity mimicking the surgeon’s wrist, superior tremor-control and stable, 3D, and high-definition visualisation.

Surgeon fatigue is reduced by the ergonomic advantages of the robotic system while the instinctive hand-eye coordination is reinstated through camera control. Robotic Surgery is now widely deployed in Urology, Gynaecology, Thoracic Surgery, Gastrointestinal Surgery, Joint-replacement Procedures and more.

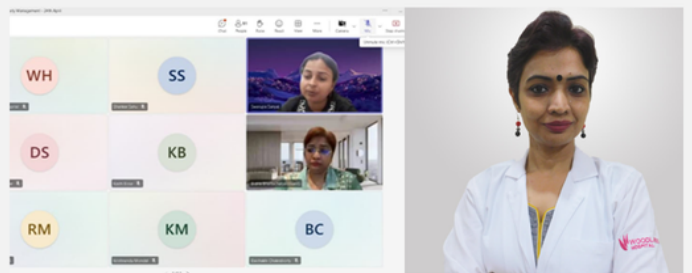
